Thanks go to our hard-working Grounds team members, who also manage the beautiful Falmouth Campus.




Fantastic Foodbank donation

A massive 423kg of food has been donated to Penryn & Falmouth Foodbank by students as they moved out of accommodation. The Halls team took 16 60-litre boxes full of tins, packets and jars to the Foodbank, which is part of The Trussell Trust Network.

John Lees, Halls Manager, said: "For a few years now we've been encouraging our students to bring all their spare, unopened food to Glasney Lodge as they leave, because it cuts waste and helps the wider community."

In addition, unwanted household items and clothes were diverted from landfill by being donated to the British Heart Foundation, as part of its Pack for Good campaign.

Renowned Polar scientist appointed Deputy Vice-Chancellor

An award-winning scientist and revered authority on the evolving climate of Antarctica has been appointed by the University of Exeter to strategically lead its operations in Cornwall.

Professor Martin Siegert FRSE will become Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Cornwall) when he joins the University from Imperial College London, where he is Co-Director of the Grantham Institute – Climate Change and Environment.

In his new role, Professor Siegert will oversee our diverse academic community on Penryn Campus, which is home to science, engineering, arts, humanities and business students, as well as the renowned Environment and Sustainability Institute (ESI).



He will also have oversight of our Truro campus, at the Royal Cornwall Hospitals NHS Trust, the location for our European Centre for Environment and Human Health (ECEHH).

Together, the ESI and ECEHH bring more than £16m of research income into Cornwall every year, which has been evaluated to create three additional jobs for every academic member of staff.

The University of Exeter supports net zero ambition

One of the key objectives of the University of Exeter signing a Memorandum of Understanding with Cornwall Council is to establish Spaceport Cornwall's reputation as the most responsible satellite launch site in the UK, with the ambition of being the first "net-zero" launch site.

Further to the University's initial carbon impact assessment, and as part of its Assessment of Environmental Effects (AEE), Spaceport Cornwall commissioned the institution to undertake a Carbon Life Cycle Report which included a Life Cycle Analysis considering the impact of wider activity around launch and onsite at Spaceport Cornwall.

The University and Council will also work together to develop space and satellite skills and education programmes, for people in Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly to participate in.



They're up in space, man...



Students from Falmouth's Creative Virtual Reality and Immersive Computing courses have collaborated with peers from Truro and Penwith College to create a bespoke educational tool for Spaceport Cornwall – who will make history when they launch the UK's first rocket into orbit from British soil later this year.

The virtual reality (VR) experience will allow young people to witness a launch in its entirety, becoming a part of the scene and enabling them to wander around the 'Arthur 6' satellite and through control room areas before meeting holograms of scientists on their travels.


"The VR experience will be available on the Oculus store, where we hope a new generation will be inspired by the possibilities they see before them," said Brian Waterfield, Head of Immersive Production at the Immersive Business Lab. "We want Cornwall to be a place where young people's passions for science, creativity and technology can be nurtured and realised as a career path. Seeing the expertise on display when the students launched the project at Goonhilly Earth Station's 60th anniversary celebrations in July, it's clear that we're in good hands."

Growing garden visitor numbers

Falmouth University is working with Cornwall's Tremeneheere Gardens to identify and explore augmented reality (AR) and virtual tools that can attract new visitors to the site.

As part of a Chinese-Cornish collaboration, the University has been granted a £100k award by the Arts and Humanities Research Council (AHRC), along with researchers at Tongji University, digital partners VisionStar and the administration of the city of Suzhou, Jiangsu Province.

"Being able to boost the engagement and enjoyment of our heritage sites here in Cornwall is a great opportunity," said Dr Doug Brown, Director of Falmouth's Games Academy.
